Extract of a Letter from Sir James Wright, Bart. Governor of the Province of Georgia, to the Right Honourable Lord George Germain, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated at Savannah the 9th of March, 1781.

N the 6th Instant, my Lord, I assented to Five Bills, and have the Satisfaction to acquaint your Lordship, that one of them is initided, "An Act for granting to His "Majefty certain Duties upon all Goods, Wares, " and Merchandize, of the Growth or Production "of this Province, which may be exported from "hence, as the Contribution of Georgia to the "General Charge of the British Empire." These Du-ties, my Lord, His Majesty's loyal Subjects in this Province have freely and chearfully given and granted, and humbly beg that His Majefty will be gracioufly pleased to condescend to accept of the same as a Imall Token of their Gratitude to His Majefty, and Affection to the Mother Country. A Duty of Five per Cent. was proposed, but the greatly distreffed, reduced, and exhausted State of the Province, it was thought, would not admit of laying on fo large a Duty at prefent; and therefore it is only Two and Half per Cent. Another is initided, "An Act "for fecuring His Majefty's Government and the "Peace of this Province, and for the more effectual "Protection of the King's loyal Subjects here " against the wicked Attempts and Defigns of the "Rebels and other difaffected Perfons, and for other Purpofes herein after mentioned:"

Britannia, off Scilly, May 16, 1781.

I HAVE only just Time to acquaint their Lord-fhips, that the Nonfuch, which parted from us the Evening of the 13th, has joined us fince Dark, having fallen in that Night with a French Man of War of 80 Guns, supposed to be the Langué-doc; she had 27 Men killed, and 50 or 60 wounded, and is much shattered.

Britannia, to the Westward of the Start, May 19, 1781.

I MENTIONED, in my Letter of the 16th Instant, the Nonfuch's having fallen in alone with a French Ship of War, of at least 80 Guns. I now enclose a Copy of Sir James Wallace's Narrative to me of that great and spirited Action.

Transactions on Board the Nonsuch, in an Engagement between the 14th and 15th of May, 1781, received in Vice-Admiral Darby's Letter of the 19th.

O N the 14th, being the look-out Ship from the Van Squadron, at Eight A. M. faw Three Spil in the N.E. Made the Signal, chaced; foon after

we faw a Sail in the E. S. E. which we took to be a French Line of Battle Ship; chaced, gained upon her. At about Half pait Ten at Night came alongfide of her; she gave us her Broadfide, we returned it; fhe dropped attern, we wore and raked her; we continued the Action for near an Hour, during fome Part of which we were on Board one another; fhe catried away our Sprit-fail-yard, and our Anchors hooking her Quarter carried away the Flukes of them. All this Time she had so much the worst of the Action, that she took the Opportunity of our Heads being different Ways to make all the Sail fhe could to get away; we wore, and chaced her again; our Mizen-maft being entirely difabled prevented our getting up with her before Five A. M. It being Day-light, we could diffinguish one another plainly; fhe appeared to be a French Eighty Gun

Some People on Board us, who pretend to know, fay the is the Languedoc. At Five we began the Action again, and continued till Half paff Six, when finding our Ship much difabled, the Fore-yard coming down, all the Mafts, Yards, Sails, and Rigging much hurt, Guns difmounted ;- the Wreck of thefe, and dead and wounded Men filling the Deck, I thought it proper to haul our Wind; in order to clear it. The Enemy kept on her Courle for Breft. Our Lofs in Men is Twenty-fix killed, and Sixty-

four wounded*.
