**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

*An Act for enabling His Majesty to raise the Sum of One Million, for the Uses and Purposes therein mentioned.*

*An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Sinking Fund; and for applying certain Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-one; and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.*

*An Act for establishing an Agreement with the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, for advancing the Sum of Two Millions, towards the Supply for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-one.*

*An Act to direct the Payment into the Exchequer of the respective Balances remaining in the Hands of the several Persons therein named, for the Use and Benefit of the Public, and for indemnifying the said respective Persons and their Representatives in respect of such Payments, and against all future Claims relating thereto, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.*

*An Act for repealing the Duties payable upon Chocolate made in Great Britain, and for granting certain Inland Duties upon Cocoa Nuts in lieu thereof; for the better and more effectual securing the Revenue of Excise, and of the Inland Duties under the Management of the Commissioners of Excise, and for preventing Frauds therein; for the more punctual and ready Payment of the Allowances to be made to Brewers out of the additional Duties imposed on Malt; and for rectifying a Mistake in an Act, made in this present Session of Parliament, with respect to the exempting of Candles from the additional Duty of Five Pounds per Centum upon the Duties of Excise imposed by the said Act.*

*An Act for granting to His Majesty an additional Duty upon Almanacks printed on one Side of any one Sheet or Piece of Paper; and for allowing a certain Annual Sum out of the said Duty to each of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge, in lieu of the Money heretofore paid to the said Universities by the Company of Stationers of the City of London, for the Privilege of printing Almanacks.*

*An Act for rendering more effectual so much of an Act, made in the Tenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for appropriating a Fund, established by an Act made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for granting to His Majesty additional Duties on certain Foreign Linens imported into this Kingdom, and for establishing a Fund for the encouraging of the raising and dressing of Hemp and Flax," as relates to the distributing and paying the Proportion of the Fund thereby appropriated for the Encouragement of the Growth of Hemp and Flax in that Part of Great Britain called England, by applying a Sum, not exceeding Fifteen Thousand Pounds per Annum, out of the said Arrears and Duties, to the Purposes aforesaid, for a Time limited.*

**W**HETHERAS there was this Day read at the Board the humble Memorial of sundry Proprietors and Merchants interested in the Island of Grenada and the Grenadines, setting forth, That the prolonged Time allowed by the Order of His Majesty in Council of the 23d of March last, for exempting such Ships belonging to the Subjects of the States of Holland, as were loaded

with



with Goods or Merchandize of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the Islands of Grenada and the Grenadines, and the Cargoes of the said Ships, from Capture, did expire on the 29th of June last; That there are several of these Ships which, from unforeseen Accidents, have not reached their Ports of Destination in Holland, the Names whereof are as follows, viz.

- The Vrow Anna, now or lately commanded by Captain Imes,
- The Juffrow Maria, now or lately commanded by Captain Koeman,
- The Vryheid, now or lately commanded by Captain Hans,
- The Gedeon and Maria, now or lately commanded by Captain Muller,
- The Rebecca and Anna, now or lately commanded by Captain Hans Hansen Ox,
- The Jonge Juffrow Anna, now or lately commanded by Captain Harmon Mulder,
- The Margareta Catharina, Captain Alexander Watson, having on board the Cargo of the Dutch Ship the St. Eustatius, Captain Lilen-dale, laden with the Produce of Grenada, which Ship by bad Weather was obliged to put into Curaçoa, and was there condemned as unfit for Sea, and her Cargo there reladen on board the Margareta Catharina, Captain Alexander Watson; all which Ships sailed before the First of April last;

That the Memorialists were not apprized of, otherwise they would have joined in, the Application to His Majesty made by the Proprietors and Merchants interested in the Island of Dominica, respecting Two Dutch Ships from that Island in a similar Situation, in consequence of which His Majesty hath been graciously pleased to grant an Extension of the Exemption from Capture of the said Two Ships and their Cargoes, for the Space of Four Months from the 29th of June; and humbly praying that the like Extension of Four Months may be granted to the Dutch Ships or Vessels above named, loaded with Goods or Merchandize of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the Islands of Grenada and the Grenadines; and that the said Ships or Vessels, and their Cargoes, may be exempted from Capture for the said Space of Four Months from the 29th of June last:—His Majesty, taking the said Memorial into His Consideration, doth hereby declare, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That the Term granted by His Majesty's said former Order in Council of the 23d of March last, shall be, in respect to the said Seven Ships, and the same is hereby prolonged for the Space of Four Months, to commence from the 29th of June last, being the Day on which the Term granted for their Return to Holland will expire: And His Majesty doth hereby order, That the said Seven Ships, the Vrow Anna, the Juffrow Maria, the Vryheid, the Gedeon and Maria, the Rebecca and Anna, the Jonge Juffrow Anna, and the Margareta Catharina, together with their respective Cargoes, shall, during the said further Term of Four Months, be considered in all Respects as Neutral Vessels going to Neutral Ports, within the Meaning and Spirit of an Act of the last Session of Parliament, intitled, "An Act to protect Goods or Merchandize of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the Islands of Grenada and the Grenadines, on board Neutral Vessels bound to Neutral Ports, during the pre-

sent Hostilities," and of the Articles of Capitulation for the Islands of St. Vincent and Dominica; and that the said Ships shall not, during the said further Term of Four Months, be liable to be detained or molested by any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or Merchant Ships having Letters of Marque and General Reprizals; provided nevertheless, that the Ships, the Vrow Anna, the Juffrow Maria, the Vryheid, the Gedeon and Maria, the Rebecca and Anna, and the Jonge Juffrow Anna, shall appear to have been cleared out from the said Island of Grenada, or the Grenadines, on or before the First Day of April last; and that they have no Goods or Merchandize on board, other than Goods of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the Island of Grenada and the Grenadines; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to protect from Condemnation any other Goods on Board the Ship Margareta Catharina, except such as were originally brought to the Island of Curaçoa by the Dutch Ship St. Eustatius, and had been laden on Board the said Ship St. Eustatius at the Islands of Grenada or the Grenadines, on or before the 1st Day of April last.
