Extracts of Two Letters from the Right Honorable General Elliott, Governor of Gibraltar, to the Earl of Hillsborough, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated Gibraltar, June 6 and 11, 1781.

I HAVE no new Occurrence to report to your Lordship, only that on the 9th Instant, the Enemy's Laboratory took Fire, with first a great Explosion, succeeded by the bursting of Shells, resembling a close running Fire of Musketry, intermixt with different Blasts, for near Twenty Minutes, and followed by a Conflagration which lasted near Three Hours. We suppose the Damage to have been very considerable, probably a Thousand six Shells, besides Powder, Implements, and Stores.

When it is calm, the Gun and Mortar Boats repeat their nightly Visits, doing us no great Harm, only depriving the Troops sometimes of their natural Rest, which is no great Evil in this Climate; as evidently appears by the Health of the Garrison.
