*Florence, June 23.* Several severe Shocks of an Earthquake have for some Weeks past done great Mischief in many Parts of the Pope's State, particularly in the Province of Umbria; the City of Cagliari was totally thrown down, and many People were buried in the Ruins. It extended on the other Part to San Sepolchro, a Town in Tuscany, where, and in the Neighbourhood, it caused great Damage. In the last Week the Great Duke sent a considerable Sum of Money to the Relief of the Inhabitants, who had fled into the Country, and still live in wooden Huts.
