Cologne, July 30. Hague, Aug. 3.. The States of Holland, after hawing consented to the payment of the 200 penny once more this year, adjourned their further Session till the 24th instant. The said States have among other things passed a resolution, whereby they confirm what the Prince of Orange and the States General have done in the affair of Groningen, and declare they will use their utmost endeavors to see the same effectually, execured, in case the City do not conform themselves thereunto within a month. The Syndick of the Ommetands hath presented another Memorial to the States, complaining of the great hindrances they meet with from their Stadtholder in the establishment of the separate Government, which the States have authorized them to make. This day we have an account of a Battel in Schonen between the Suedish and the Danish Army, The fum whereof is, that the left Wings were beaten, as likewise some Colours and Prisoners taken on both fides; that the King of Denmark seeing his Foot much weakned, and his Army tired, by reason of the great heat of the day, gave over pursuing his advantage with his right Wing, where he was in person, and recired to his Camp, and the Suedes not following, the Battel On the part of the Danes, the Foot is said to have suffered most; and on the Suedes, the Horse. Several General Officers and Colonels are ki led and taken on both sides. The Germans are by all allowed to have performed their parts with/a great deal of courage in this occasion; burespecially the left Wing of Danes to have been wanting in their duty, for which several of the Officers will be exemplarily punished for a terror to others in the future. This night or to motrow morning the Raedt Pentionary Fagel parts hence to the Army, to confer with his Highness the Prince of Orango; from whence we have advice; that Charlergy was besieged on Sunday last.

Bruffels, Aug. 6. Yesterday the great Convoy with

Postscript. We are rold this evening that a great Convoy of Wagons, with Provisions for the Imperial Army, and also many Pontons, which were going from, Luxemburg to the Duke of Lorrains Camp, were forced, to return again, 4000 French Horse being in Ambus-cado to have taken them. Many skirmishes pass daily between parties with various success, and in a very late one, Count Stirum, who commanded them, was taken prisoner,
