T Half patt Nine o'Clock this Morning The King, and His Royal Highnels the Prince of Wales, arrived at Greenwich Holpital; were received by the Earl of

Sandwich, First Lord of the Admiralty, the Go-vernor, and Principal Officers of the Hospital, and immediately went in a Barge, attended by Lord Sandwich, the Marquifs of Lothian, Gold Stick, Colonel Townshend, and Lieutenant Colonel Greville, on Board the Princels Augusta Yacht, commanded by Sir Richard Bickerton, where His Royal Stan-dard, Admiralty, and Union Flags were holfted. The Prince of Wales embarked in another Barge, and went on Board the William and Mary Yacht, commanded by Captain Young, where His Royal Highnefs's Standard was hoisted; the Prince was at-tended by Lord Southampton, Lieutenant-Colonel Hulfe, and Mr. Digby. At Ten o'Clock the Yachts got under Sail, and proceeded down the River with a fair Wind, and were faluted, as they passed Woolwich Warren, by the Ships in Long Reach, and by Tilbury and Gravefend Forts ; and at Four o'Clock came to an Anchor in Sea Reach.

#### August 18.

The Yachts got under Way this Morning at Five o'Clock, and arrived at Blackstakes about Nine, and were faluted by the Garrison at Sheerness as they passed Soon afterwards His Majesty and the Prince of Wales went on Shore, and vifited the Dock-yard and the new Fortifications, attended by Lord Amherft, Ge-nerals Craig and Faucitt; and at Twelve o'Clock The King and the Prince of Wales left the Yard, and returned to the Nore, where they were faluted by Vice-Admiral Parker and his Squadron, who were that Moment come to an Anchor. The Vicethat Moment come to an Anchor. The Vice-Admiral had the Honor of Dining with His Majefty; and in the Evening The King and the Prince of Wales went on Board the Fortitude, in which Ship the Vice-Admiral's Flag was flying : As foon as the Royal Standard was hoilted in the Fortitude, the whole Fleet faluted with Twenty-one Guns each. Soon after His Majefty retired into the Great Cabin, where the Captains and Officers of his Squarron, with thole of the Ships prefent, were all received very gracioully, and had the Honor to kifs The King's Hand. His Majefty and the Prince of Wales, after having vifited the different Parts of the Ship, returned to the Yacht, and failed for Cha-tham, where they arrived at Nine o'Clock on Sunday Morning.

#### August 19.

This Day Vice-Admiral Parker's Fleet failed from the Nore, and anchored at Blackstakes, in order to repair the Damages suffained in their late Action with the Dutch Fleet upon the Dogger Bank,

## Admiralty-Office, August 21, 1781.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Drury, of His Ma-

jesty's Sloop Cameleon, to Mr. Stephens, dated Shields, August 16, 1781. BE pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, in Confequence of an Order from Vice-Admiral Drake, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels in the Downs, to exercise between the Galloper, Middleburgh, and the Broad Fourteens, the 14th Inflant, at Six A. M. the Texel bearing S. E. diftant Six Leagues, we gave Chace to a Dutch Dogger, belonging to the States of Holland, mounting 18 Six-Pounders and 20 Swivels; a Quarter before Nine got clofe alongfide, and defired him to ftrike his Colours to His Britannic Majefty's Flag : He immediately fired his Broadfide into us, which we inflantly returned, and continued the Action, Yard-arm and Yard-arm, till Half paft Nine; the then blew up, clofe alongfide. The Shock was to very great, that it thook the Peo-ple off their Legs, and the Cloud of Smoke was to very thick, that it was impossible to fee each other upon Deck for the Space of Two Minutes: It then began to clear away, and we foon perceived our Topfails on Fire in feveral Places, particularly the Main-top-fail and Fore-top-gallant-fail, which I was obliged to cut from the Yards. The Fire in out Sails was occasioned by the Splinters from the Wreck, which had blown up in the Explosion ; ma-ny. Pieces of human Flefh were found flicking against our Masts and Rigging, and some Limbs of the Dutchmen were taken up upon Deck. We have great Reason to believe that his Main-mast went over us, as we faw it about the Veffel's Léngth to Leeward of us; his Colours flew on Board us all on Fire. We as foon as poffible hoisted out our Boat, in Hopes of taking up fome of the People, but could not fee one living : We picked up his Pendant, and a Marine's Hat.

It is with the greatest Pleasure I can inform their Lordships, that I had only Twelve Men wounded in the Action, none of which appear at prefent dangerous. I am the only Officer hurt, having from a Splinter received a flight Hurt in my Leg, which in all Probability will be foon well. A good deal of Injury is done to the Ship in her

Sails and Rigging: In her Hull there was no Shot of Confequence that I at prefent know of, except One which went through between Wind and Water, knocked down Two Men in the Magazine, and afterwards lodged in the Mafter's Bed-place.

In Justice to my Ship's Company, I cannot conclude without acquainting their Lordships with the steady and resolute Behaviour of my Officers and Crew on this Occasion, as it merits my warmeft Praises and Admiration, and I hope it will recom-mend them to their Lordships Favour.
