OUR Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Auistants of the City of Rochester, cannot omit any Opportun ty to repeat and affire your Majetty of our unshaken Fidelity to your Royal Person and Family; and, fentible of the Bleffings we enjoy under your Majesty's mild Government of our Constitution in Church and State, beg Leave to assure you, that we shall be always ready and desirous, in our feveral Stations, to do the utmost in our Power to support your Majesty in resisting and frustrating every hostile Attempt which your Enemies may make against your Majesty, and the Rights and Interest of our happy Constitution: And that your Majelly may have a long and prosperous Reign, are the urdent Wishes of your most loyal Corporation of Ro. chester.
