A S feweral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that whey extend to those who are any ways concerned or inthey extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Ma-mufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Export-ation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. F any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminifer, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, fhall go into any Country out of His Ma-jefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Paole within Six Months after Warning given by Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorized by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devife or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majelly's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefly's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice ; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear, at the next Affizes or Quarter Seftions : And if fuch Perfon shall refule to give Secarity, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convict upon Indictment of any fuch Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpoles aforefaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of

His Majefty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reusonable, and shall be imprilined till Security <sup>a</sup>given.

Statute z3 George II. Chap. 13. **I**F any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk; or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, .or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in Eng-land, or by Indistment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender thall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cale of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons to again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures; or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Of-fence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fball feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or It the Captain or any venerin Great Dritan or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he thall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefly, the Captain faill not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefly,

or ar the devenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfelt ONE HUNDBED. POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures that be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.
