The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majesty has received Information from Sir Robert Ainsie, His Majeste's Ambassador at Constantinople, and from Sir William Ha-His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Naples, That the Plague rages violently at prefent in many Parts of the Levant; and that, in consequence of the melancholy Accounts, His Sicilian Majesty has issued several Orders, containing Precaut ons for the Preservation of the Public Health, and enjoining the due Performance of Quarantine by all Vessels from the Venetian and Austrian Dalmatia, and from Venice and it's Neighbourhood, and the Islands of Malta and Sicily: And whereas a Quarantine of Forty Days is at this Time subsisting by the Orders of this Board, bearing Date the 8 h Day of July, 1772, the 11th of November, 1778, and the 20th of September, 1780, upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary or the Adams of the second of the bary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain within the Mediterranean, or from Minorca or Gibraltar, into any Port of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, and also upon all Ships and Vessels whatsoever having certain Species of Goods and Merchandize on Board, enumerated in His Majesty's Order in Council of the zoth of September, 1780, as more especially liable to retain Insection, and which may be brought from Constantinople and other Parts of the Eevant into other Co intries, and from thence imported into His Majesty's Dominions, in Ships not obliged to perform Quarantine: His Majesty in Council is therefore hereby pleased to notify the same, that all Persons whom it may concern may be duly apprized thereof; and His Majesty conceives it proper upon the present Occasion to order, require, and command, That all the Rules, Regulations and Directions laid down in the aforesaid Orders in Council, touching the Performance of Quarantine, be punctually and strictly complied with.
