P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has received Information from Sir Robert Ainslie, His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, and from Sir William Hamilton, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Naples, That the Plague rages violently at present in many Parts of the Levant; and that, in consequence of the melancholy Accidents, His Sicilian Majesty has issued several Orders, containing Precautions for the Preservation of the Public Health, and enjoining the due Performance of Quarantine by all Vessels from the Venetian and Austrian Dalmatia, and from Venice and its Neighbourhood, and the Islands of Malta and Sicily: And whereas a Quarantine of Forty Days is at this Time subsisting by the Orders of this Board, bearing Date the 8th Day of July, 1772, the 11th of November, 1778, and the 20th of September, 1780, upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain within the Mediterranean, or from Minorca or Gibraltar, into any Port of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, and also upon all Ships and Vessels whatsoever having certain Species of Goods and Merchandize on Board, enumerated in His Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th of September, 1780, as more especially liable to retain Infection; and which may be brought from Constantinople and other Parts of the Levant into other Countries, and from thence imported into His Majesty's Dominions, in Ships not obliged to perform Quarantine: His Majesty in Council is therefore hereby pleased to notify the same, that all Persons whom it may concern may be duly apprized thereof; and His Majesty conceives it proper upon the present Occasion to order, require, and command, That all the Rules, Regulations and Directions laid down in the aforesaid Orders in Council, touching the Performance of Quarantine, be punctually and strictly complied with. And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

St. James's, September 8, 1781.

It has been humbly represented to the King, That on Friday the 25th Day of August, 1780, about One of the Clock in the Morning, Five Persons unknown, armed with Clubs and other offensive Weapons, came to the House of John Bursey, late a Riding Officer of the Customs at Milton in the County of Southampton, and, under Pretence of giving the said Bursey an Information, whereby he might make a Seizure of some uncustomed Goods, prevailed on him to get up (the said Bursey being then in Bed) and to come down and open his Door; that they thereupon immediately rushed in upon him, and with the said Clubs and other Weapons beat and treated him so unmercifully, by giving him several dangerous Wounds on the Head and other Parts of his Body, that he languished till the 27th, and then died; and the Coroner's Inquest having set on the Body, have brought in their Verdict Wilful Murder against the said Five Persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplices, (excepting the Person who actually killed the Officer) so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

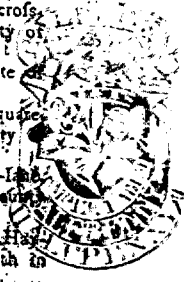
