St. James's, September 11.

THIS Morning a Messenger arrived at the Office of the Earl of Hillsborough, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, with a Letter to his Lordship from Sir Horace Mann, Bart. and K. B. His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary at Florence, inclosing a Letter from Lieutenant-General Murray, Governor of Minorca, dated St. Philip's Castle, August 19, in which the Governor gives an Account, that a Division of the Spanish Fleet and Transports was pushing that Morning to the East Part of the Harbour of Mahon, with an Intention, as was supposed, to land Troops in that Quarter; and that another Division appeared to be going to the West Part of the Harbour. The Governor adds, that he had been for some Time apprized of the Intention of the Enemy, was perfectly prepared to receive them; that the Garrison was in high Health and Spirits, and that he had no Doubt of making a vigorous Resistance.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Friday the 25th Day of August, 1780, about One of the Clock in the Morning, Five Persons unknown, armed with Clubs and other offensive Weapons, came to the House of John Bursey, late a Riding Officer of the Customs at Millon in the County of Southampton, and, under Pretence of giving the said Bursey an Information, whereby he might make a Seizure of some uncustomed Goods, prevailed on him to get up (the said Bursey being then in Bed) and to come down and open his Door; that they thereupon immediately rushed in upon him, and with the said Clubs and other Weapons beat and treated him so unmercifully, by giving him several dangerous Wounds on the Head and other Parts of his Body, that he languished till the 27th, and then died; and the Coroner's Inquest having set on the Body, have brought in their Verdict Wilful Murder against the said Five Persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplices, (excepting the Person who actually killed the Officer) so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
