A.S several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreiga Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them .- And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or in-firumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as. well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

I Fany Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artisicer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Performance of the part of fon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and im prisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Arti-ficers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be: or by any Person authorized by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Person shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes afore-faid; such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if thall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession; that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Asile or Quarter Sessions: Add if such Person skill as Sessions. Sons: And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convict upon Indictment of any such Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpoles aforelaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Conton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock maker, Watch maker, por any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures, of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Conntry, not within the Dominions of the Crawn of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Afficie or General. Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or of Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Officee be committed in freland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, for est FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-somment in the Common Goal of the County of Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted; for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forseiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending hall forfeit, for every Perion contracted with of feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS; and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaor of the County of Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall por on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Fools or Utenfils as are tommonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working ap or Finishing of the Woollen or Sike Manufactures; or any Part of such Tools, he shall for every of sence forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Asia of Date of Date of Tools, and Two Hundred Pounds, and Two Hundred Pounds and Hundred Pound be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the hest Bidder; and one Moiery of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesti and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feite and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great British If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain of Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools prohibited to be exported, to be put on Boarder Veffel, he shall for every such Offence forfeit CALL HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered Penalties inslicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majestithe Captain shall not only forfeit ONE. Hundred the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE, HUM, DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majel ý.

Let R. D. A. Worning I received your Dispatch of the 20th of July, with the Internal Contain

He personally conducted their Attack in his Barge with distinguished Success, notwithstanding a constant and heavy Fire of Round and Grape from the knemy's Gun Boats for nearly Two Hours. The Particulars of Captain Roberts's callent Rehaviour and his lars of Captain Roberts's gallant Behaviour and his Ship will, no Doubt, be transmitted by Captain Curtis; but as he (Captain Curtis) is not a Man to speak of any Transaction so highly redounding to his own Honour, on my Part it is an indispen-sable Duty to inform your Lordship, that his Zeal for the Service is scarcely to be paralleled in forwarding every Operation that can any Way contribute to our Comfort or Desence.

BEG you will be pleased to acquaint my Lords Commissioners, that His Majesty's Sloop Helena

arrived here this Morning.

Her Approach was discovered by the Enemy and us at the same Time, about Five o'Clock. She was in the Gut, to the Southward of Cabarita Point, and nearly a Third of the Way over from it to-wards Europa. It was perfectly calm, and the He-lena was rowing for the Rock. I immediately took the Repulse and Vanguard Gun-Boats, with all the Boats of the Ships, and went for her as expeditionly as possible. Fourteen Gun-Boats of the Enemy, carrying each One Twenty-fix Pounder in the Bow, moved also from Algaziras, accompanied by several Launches. These Boats got on faster than I could proceed with the Repulse and Vanguard, and before Eight o'Clock those of them the most advanced commenced their Fire upon the being then within Half Gun-shot. She returned it with great Deliberation and Effect, but Rill continuing to use her Oars. The greater Part of the Gun-Boats were soon close to her, and the Clouds of Grape and other Shot, that feemed al-most to bury her, were really assonishing. However she did not, without some Aid, bear long this very unequal Combat. The Repulse and Vanguard began a well-directed Fire upon the Enemy, being fo placed as was deemed the most efficacious to co-ver the Helena, and annoy them. The Com-mencement of the Sea Breeze having got to the Helena, the foon reached us, the knemy still perfe-vering in their Attemat upon her. The of them vering in their Attempt upon her; some of them

exhibited on Board the Helena, and the well-applied Grape from the Repulse and Vanguard, very foon made feveral of them retire; and they all fled by Ten o'Clock, allowing us to fow the Helena into the Mole without farther Weleflation. A Rebeck, mounting between Twenty and Thirty Guns, which was lying near to Cabarija Point, got under Way when the Breeze came, and advanced to join the Gon-

Boats; but, upon feeing them retire; she retired also. The Masts, Sails, Rigging and Furniture of the Helena are cut all to Pieces, and the Huil a good Deal damaged; but it is wonderful, as it is fortunate, the Boatswain was the only Man who was

killed on Board her.

The Bravery, the Coolness, and the judicious Conduct of Captain Roberts + do him infinite Ho-nour: His Officers and Men deserve the highest Commendation.

Captain Roberts was First Lieutenant of the Quebeck with Cap ain Farmer, when the was burnt in Action with the Surveillant.
