Extract of a Letter from Commodore Affleck to Mr. Stephens, dated at New York, August 13, 1781.

S I R,

**I**HAVE the Pleasure to inform their Lordships of the Arrival of His Majesty's Ship Iris, from her Station off the Delaware, with the Trumbull Rebel Frigate of 32 Guns and 200 Men, taken by her on the 9th Instant, after a running Fight of about an Hour, in which the Iris had 1 Man killed and 6 wounded; and the Enemy had 2 killed, and 3 Lieutenants, and 7 Men, wounded.

While I am writing, is this Instant arrived the Bellifarius, a very fast-sailing Frigate of 20 Guns and 147 Men, belonging to Salem, captured by the Medea on the 7th Instant, off the Delaware.
