The King has been pleased to grant to Elizabeth Rowlls, of Kingston upon Thames in the County of Surry, Widow, Niece of Charles Legh, late of Adlington Hall in the County of Chester, Esq; deceased, (pursuant to a Deed of Settlement made on the Marriage of her Son John Rowlls, Esq; with Harriet Warburton, Spinster) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Sur-name and bear the Arms of Legh, instead of those of Rowlls, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Dublin, September 25, 1781.

Dresden, September 9. Yesterday his Serene Highness Prince Charles, Brother to the Elector, died here, after a tedious Illness, in the Thirtieth Year of his Age, to the great Grief of the whole Electoral Family.
