**T**HE King has been pleased to grant to the Reverend Robert Pool Finch, Doctor in Divinity, the Place and Dignity of a Prebendary of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the Death of the Reverend Doctor Thomas Marriott.

The King has been pleased to grant to Elizabeth Rowlls, of Kingston upon Thames in the County of Surry, Widow, Niece of Charles Legh, Esq; deceased, (pursuant to a Deed of Settlement made on the Marriage of her Son John Rowlls, Esq; with Harriet Warburton, Spinster) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Sur-name and bear the Arms of Legh, instead of those of Rowlls, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Dublin, September 25, 1781.

Saturday last, being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was hoisted on Bedford Tower; at Noon the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires and other Demonstrations of Joy.

Dresden, September 9. Yesterday his Serene Highness Prince Charles, Brother to the Elector, died here, after a tedious Illness, in the Thirtieth Year of his Age, to the great Grief of the whole Electoral Family.
