St. James's, October 27.

THURSDAY last, being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, when His Majesty entered into the Twenty-second Year of His Reign, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment His Majesty upon the Occasion. At One o'Clock the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other public Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Thursday the 18th Day of the present Month of October, about Six o'Clock in the Evening, some Hay Stacks, the Property of Mr. Richard Ayrton, of Malton in the County of York, and standing in a Close, in his Occupation, at Welbourn in the same County, rented of the Earl of Carlisle, were awfully and maliciously set on Fire by some Person or Persons unknown, and the Whole thereby entirely consumed:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of them (except the Person or Persons who did actually set Fire to the said Stacks, or either of them) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
