UESDAY last, being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in State to Christ-Church, attended by feveral of the Nobility, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse. After his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: And at Night there were Boufires, Illuminations, and other Rejoicings throughout the City.

This Day, being the Annivertary of His Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower: At Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: In the Evening a Play was given by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
