E pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majerty's Ship the Chatham, Captain Andrew Snape Douglas, is ar rived here with the Magici nne, a French Frigace of 32 Guns, Twelve Pounders, and 280 Men. commanded by the Chevalier Bouchtierre, which was taken the 2d Inflant, within Three Miles of Bolton.

The Enemy engaged the Chatham half an Hour, (although close alongfide) during which Time he had 32 Men killed and 54 wounded. The Chatham lost only Two Men in the Action, and had Four wounded.
