WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, early in the Morning of Sunday the 7th Day of May, 1780, a most barbarous and inhuman Murder was committed, at Berron in the County of Worcester, on Edward Gummery, Elizabeth his Wife, Ann their Daughter, and Thomas Sheen, who were all found dead, on the Morning above mentioned, in the Dwelling-house of the said Edward Gummery, and their Bodies bruised and mangled in a most shocking Manner; and that all Endeavours to discover the Perpetrators of so horrid a Crime have hitherto proved ineffectual:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons guilty of the Crime above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
