ON the 24th Instant, in the Morning, her Royal Highness Princess Maria Charlotte Anchoinette, of Savoy, arrived in this City, and was received with the greatest Acclamations and Honours. At Six o'Clock the same Evening the Nuptial Ceremony was performed between Prince Anthony and the Princess in the private Electoral Chapel, and on the following Day the Prince and Princess received the Compliments of Congratulation of all the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. St. James's, November 17, 1781.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, early in the Morning, of Sunday the 7th Day of May, 1780, a most barbarous and inhuman Murder was committed, at Berrow in the County of Worcester, on Edward Gummery, Elizabeth his Wife, Ann their Daughter, and Thomas Sheen, who were all found dead, on the Morning above mentioned, in the Dwelling-house of the said Edward Gummery, and their Bodies bruised and mangled in a most shocking Manner; and that all Endeavours to discover the Perpetrators of so horrid a Crime have hitherto proved ineffectual:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons guilty of the Crime above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his

or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

STORMONT.

Custom-House, London, November 24, 1781.

WHEREAS, on Friday the 2d Day of this Instant November, a large Seizure of Brandy was made by several of the Officers belonging to this Revenue, at East Parley in the Parish of Christchurch, Hants, and whilst the said Officers were endeavouring to convey the same to a Place of Safety, a daring and outrageous Gang of Smugglers, on Horseback, to the Number of Twelve and upwards, (some of whom had their Faces blacked, and were otherwise disguised) armed with Blunderbusses, Musquets, Pistols, and other offensive Weapons, forcibly and violently assaulted, beat, and wounded the said Officers, and rescued and carried away the said Seizure:

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to such Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the Persons concerned in this most atrocious Offence, to be paid by the Receiver General and Cashier of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction. And if any of the said Offender or Offenders shall discover two or more of his or their Accomplices to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, and apprehend or cause them to be apprehended, so as two at least be brought to Justice and convicted, the Offender or Offenders so discovering, in pursuance of the Act of the 19th of George II. shall have and receive the Sum of Fifty Pounds for every such Offender so discovered and convicted, to be paid by the said Receiver-General and Cashier on Conviction, and be clearly acquitted of his or their Offence.
