St. James's, December 4.

BY Letters from the Honourable Lieutenant-General Murray, dated St. Philip's Castle, the 12th and 13th of November, Information is received, that the Duke de Crillon took Post at Cape Mola in such a Manner as to put it in the Power of the Garrison to chase him from thence; and although his whole Army advanced to dislodge the Troops, they were able to maintain their Ground; and when the Enemy saw their Disposition, they were contented not to attack them, so that they retired quietly into the Fort, with 100 Prisoners, including a Lieutenant-Colonel, Three Captains, and Five Subaltern Officers; having suffered no other Loss than One Man killed upon the Spot, and Two are since dead of their Wounds:—That the Enemy opened their Mortar Batteries on the 11th of November, and on the 13th had not damaged a single Article, One Carriage of a Six-pounder excepted:—That the Enemy's Powder Magazine, behind Turk's Mount, had been blown up by one of the Shells from the Castle, by which the Mortar Battery of the Enemy was destroyed; and it was presumed that their Loss of Men must be considerable, as a great many were blown up, and a great Number of Shells burst at the same Time: And that the Artillery of the Castle, which is excellent, had some Time before sunk, at the Quay of George Town, a Vessel loaded with Ammunition and Stores for the Enemy's Batteries, which must be a great Loss and Retardment to them.
