Y Letters from the Honourable Lieutenant-General Murray, dated St. Philip's Castle, the 12th and 13th of November, Information is received, that the Duke de Crillon took Post at Cape Mola in such a Manner as to put it in the Power of the Garrison to chafe him from thence; and although his whole Army advanced to diflodge the Troops, they were able to maintain their Ground ; and when the Eveny faw their Disposition, they were contented not to attack them, so that they retired quietly into the Fort, with 100 Prisoners, including a Lieutenant-Colonel, Three Captains, and Five Subaltern Officers, having suffered no other Loss than One Man killed upon the Spot, and Two are fince dead of their Wounds :----That the Enemy opened their Mortar Batteries on the 11th of Novem-ber, and on the 13th had not damaged a fingle Article, One Carriage of a Six-pounder excepted a That the Enemy's Powder Magazine, behind Turk's Mount, had been blown up by one of the Shells from the Caftle, by which the Mortar Battery of the Enemy was deftroyed; and it was prefumed that their Lofs of Men must be confiderable, as a great many were blown up, and a great Number of Shells burk at the fame Time - And that the Artil lery of the Caffle, which is excellent, had fome Time before funk, at the Quay of George Town, a Veffel loaded with Ammunition and Stores for the Enemy's Batteries, which must be a great Loss and Retardment to them.
