Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Saturday the 17th of November last, between Six and Seven o'Clock in the Evening, Thomas Kent, Farmer, of Benington in the County of Hertford, Farmer, was stopped, in his Return from Hertford Market, at a Place called Cutting Hill, by some Person or Persons unknown, who robbed him of what Money he had in his Pockets, fractured his Skull in several Places, and then tossed him into his Cart, and set the Horse going, which carried him Home; and that the said Thomas Kent languished of his Wounds till the Monday following, when he expired: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And the Commissioners, for the more conveniently receiving the said Reward by the Person intitled to the same, have given Orders to their Distributors in the several Counties to pay the same.
