St. James's, December 5, 1781. WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King; That, on Saturday the 17th of November last; between Six and Sevin o'Clock in the Evening, Thomas Kent, Farmer, of Benington in the County of Hertford, Farmer, was flopped, in his Return from Hertford Market, at a Place called Cutting Hill, by lome Person or Persons unknown, who robbed him of what Money he had in his Potkets; fractured his Skull in Jeweral Places, and then tossed him into his Cart, and jet the Horse going, which carried him Home; and that the said Thomas Kent languished of his Wounds'till the Monday following, when he expired:
