

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of Ocber, 1776, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st of December then follow. ing, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as thould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds, for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfeiver, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majelty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the 31st Day of De-Cember, 1776: And whereas His Majefty was like-wile pleafed; by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Thirty-five, when under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould voluntarily enter him-felf to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships, on or before the 31ft Day of October then next, fhould receive, as of His Majefty's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards fhould be continued to be paid for, fome Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered; that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this inflant December to the 31ft Day of March next, inclu-five.——Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 14th of September last, for continuing the Prohibition on the Exportation, or carrying of Copper Coaffwife, (except as therein mentioned) will expire on the 22d of this inftant December; and whereas His

hibition shoud be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the faid Prohi-bition be continued for Six Months, to commence from, the 22d Day of this inflant December; But it is His Majefty's Pleafure, that the fame fhall not the taken to extend to any Sort of Conner to be exbe taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be ex-ported or fent Coaffwife by the Commiffioners of His Majefly's Navy, or their Officers or Agents, for His Majefty's Service, or to the carrying of any Sore of Copper Coastwise, upon Condition that sufficient Security by Bond be given to the proper Officer or Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, in Treit's the Value thereof, to carry the fame to the Places proposed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, from the pro-per Officer or Officers of the Customs at the Ports for which any Copper that he entered and cleared for which any Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the same having been all duly landed at such Ports; which Certificate or Certificates such Officer or Officers are hereby required to give ; and the fame Certificate or Certificates the Commiffioners of the Cuftoms are hereby required to transmitted to the Lords Committioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board; and His Majefty is further pleafed to order, that the Exportation of Copper in Cakes, or in Plates, not weighing lefs than Four Pounds to the Foot fuperficial, to any Parts bound the Seas, to which the fame may be lawfully exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain, or to the States Gene-ral of the United Provinces) (hall continue to be allowed during the faid Term of Six Months, upon anowed during the laid 1 erm of Six Months, upon Condition, that all fuch Copper as is intended to be exported fhall be infpected and examined by an Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Commifficiences of His Majefty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent of Agents shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of fuch Copper confilts of Cakes or Plates of Copper weighing less than Four Pounds to the Foot superficial; which Certificate from the faid Agent or Agents shall be de-lived to the proper Officer or Officers of the Cuf-toms at the Port in which the faid Copper is inended to be shipped, and shall be their Autho-sity for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board and exported. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
