

St. James's, December 22. AS several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects Great Britain, batue from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the Rirst and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them .- And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Entiting Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

S:atute 5 George I. Chap. 27. F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, W tch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-S-stions, he shall be fixed any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict. shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and im priloned I welve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

'If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's

Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return is to this Realm within 51x Months after Warning given by the Amb ssacor, Manuster or Consul of Great wittain, in the Country where such Artificers in ... be, or by any version authorized by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and Ir in thenceforth inhabit within this Reaim; tuch Person shall be incapable of taking any Legacy of of coing an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this King com, by Percent, Devite or Purchase; and their forfeit all Lance, Goods, &c. within this Kingcom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His

Majelly s Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath befor any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavour ing to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of this Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforesaid; such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Person shall resule to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convict upon Indictment of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purposes aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the same shall be prosecuted in the

Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in 1700, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufacture. any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, forseit FIVE HUNDRED FOUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeitule be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of fame Kind, the Persons so again offending thall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convided, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fame Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly aled in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up

or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Gfence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and I'WO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dubin respectively, wherein no Essin, &c. Thall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuitoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to teize and secure, in some of His Ma jeily's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound airectly to some Port in Great Gritain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the roduce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and fecure the fame.

li the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, promitted to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Offence forseit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Suffe ance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.
