Extract of a Letter from the Right Honourable Genexal Blioit, Governor, of Gibraltar, to the Earl of Hullforingh, One of His Majefy's Principal Secretaries of State, dated Gibraltar, November 28, 1781; received December 27.

HAVE the Honour to communicate to your Lordhip, that the uniform Appearance of the Enemy's Operations fufficiently flewing, that an Attempt to florm and defify the Whole of their Advanced Works, now arrived at the higheft State of Perfection, after immenfe Labour and Expence, would probably be attended with the defired Success, it was therefore judged expedient to carry the same into immediate Execution.

The necessary Arrangements being made, a con-fiderable Detachment, formed in Three Columns, marched from the Garrison, upon the Setting of the Moon, at Three o'Clock on the Morning of the 27th Instant. The Columns were severally com-posed of an Advanced Corps, a Body of Pioneers, Artillery-Men carrying Combultibles, a Suftaining Corps, with a Referve in the Rear. The Pioneers of the Left Column were Seamen from His Majef.

ty's Ships. The Force of the Enemy? in their Lines and Advanced Works, confined of Fifty or Sixty Ca. walry, and Six Hundred Infantry, composed of the Spanish and Walloon Guards, Artillerist, Cassa-

Jores, and other Light Troops, befides the ufual Body of Workmen carrying their Arms. The \*igorous Efforts of His Majelty's Troops, geovery East of the exterior Front, were irrefilti-ble; and the Enemy, after a feattering Fire of flort Duration, gave Way on all Sides, and abandoned their flupendous Works with great Precipitation:

The Pioneers and Artillerists made wonderfal Exertions, and fpread their Fire with fuch amazing Rapidity, that in Half an Hour Two Mortar Batte-ries of Ten Thirteen Inch Mortars, and Three Batieries of Six Guns each, with all the Lines of Ap-proach, "Communication Traverles, &c. were in Flames, and are reduced to Alhes. The Mortais and Cannon were fpiked, and their Beds; Carff-ages and Platforms destroyed. Their Magazines blew up, one after another, as the Fire approached them.

The Enemy, feeing all Opposition to be inef-fectual, offered no other Annoyance than an ill-directed Fire of Round and Grape Shot from the Forts St. Barbara and St. Philipe, and alle Batteries on the Lines, and remained in their .Camp Specta. tors of the Conflagration.

tors of the Confagration. The whole Detachment was in the Garrifon again by Five o'Clock, just before the Break of Day. Brigadie: General Rofs had the Chief Command, and conducted the Attack with 16 much Judgment, through the Variety of critical Insidents attending an Enterprize of this Nature, as highly considured, to the general Success. The Center Column was led by Ligutenant-Colonel Dachenhaufen, of Re-den's Regiment; the Right by Ligutenant-Colonel Hugo, of Hardenbergh's : the Left by Ligutenant-Hugo, of Hardenbergh's ; the Left by Lieutenant-Colonel Trig, of the 12th; and the Referve by Major Maxwell, of the 75d.
