Smith, and put off a forged Draft at Brecknock : Alfo, in that Year Joseph put off a forged Draft hear Sutton Coldfield, in Warwickshire, taking the

Name of Joseph Hart. The two Westons are supposed to be well known either by fome of the before-mentioned Names, or the Names of Smith, Walker, Hill, and Weff, in almost every Part of this Kingdom, except the West of England, and to be connected with an Attorney of notorious Character in Worcestershire, and his Confederates.

Immediately after committing the Robbery of the Mail, George Wefton fet out in a Polt Chaife and Four from London, (or the Neighbourhood) through Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, York-shire, and Northumberland, to Newcassle, from thence to Carlifle, and from that City by the Great North Road to London, putting off Bills and Notes at various Places in his Route; and one or both of them are fuppofed to have been laft Summer at a Fair at Mortham, near Rotherham, and at Laun-cefton, at each of which Places a Bill taken out of this Mail was negociated by them.

Within the two last Months they have put off feveral Notes and Bills at Lottery-Offices in London, and George by himfelf has, within that Time, put off one at Richmond in Surry, and another at Hack-

ney, affaming the Name of John Ward. George Welton is about 29 Years of Age, 5 Feet 7 Inches high, fquare fet, round faced, fresh coloured, pitted with the Small Pox, has a short thick Nofe, his upper Lip rather thick, his Hair of a lightifh-brown Colour, which is fometimes tied be-hind, at other Times loofe and curled; has much the Appearance of a Country Dealer, or a Farmer; one of his Thumb Nails appears, from an Accident, of the Shape of a Parrot's Bill, and he is fuppofed to have a Scar opon his Right Hand from a Stroke with a Cutlafs.

Joseph Weston is about 23 Years of Age, 5 Feet 6 Inches high, slender made, of a fair and smooth Complexion, genteel Person, has grey Eyes, and large Nose with a Scar upon it, his Hair is of a light brown Colour, fometimes tied behind, at other times loofe and curled, his Voice firong, and he fpeaks a little through his Nofe; has a remarkable fmall Hand and long Fingers.

Whoever shall apprehend, or cause to be apprehended, the said George Weston and Joseph Weston, or either of them, will, upon the Conviction of one or both of them for the faid Robbery of the Mail, be intitled to a Reward of FWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parlia-ment for apprehending Highwaymen, agreeably to the ment for apprehending Highwaymen, agreeably to the faid Advertisement. — And, as it is well known that a Person in the Mercantile Line has affished them in the Negociation of some of the Bills, if he, or any other Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, will make Discovery, whereby either or both of the faid Westons may be apprehended and convicted of the fame, he or they will be intitled to the faid Reward of TWO HUND RED POUNDS, and will also waited. receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
