His Maight dock therefore her the faid Orders: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perion or Perions whosoever (except the Muster-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this instant February, presume to transports into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Coard any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coaltwise, except in the Cases com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties indicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to improve His Majesty to prohibit the French "to impower His Majetty to prohibit the Ex"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law
"for empowering His Majetty to prohibit the
"Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of
"Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower


