Bakeries (which are always to be as near as posfible to the Camps) will be defrayed by Government.

The Contractor shall always have a Sufficiency of Flour, and all the other Articles, in the Magazines, for the Supply of Sixteen Days in Advance, till he shall be ordered to the contrary.

The Proposals are to be delivered, sealed up, and directed to either of their Lordships Secretaries, any Time on or before the Twenty-Sixth Day of March instant, and to be marked on the Out-side, Propofals for the Camp Contract.
