Admiralty-Office, April 27, 1782. SIR George Rodney, in his Letter dated Gros Islet Bay, St. Lucia, the 15th of March, mentions that he arrived at Barbadoes the 19th of February with Twelve Ships of the Line; that he formed a Junction with Rear-Admiral oir Samuel Hood on the 25th, to Windward of Antigua; that he was afterwards joined by the Duke, Valiant, and Warrior, from England; and that, having com-pleated the Provisions and Water of the Squadron, was preparing to fail upon a Cruize, to watch the Motions of the Enemy's Fleet at Martinique, which consisted of Thirty-one Sail of the Line, including Two Fifty Gun Ships.

Duhlin Castle, April 18.

This Day the Earl of Carlifle, late Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, embarked on Board His Majesty's Yacht the Dorset, on his Return to England.

His Grace the Duke of Portland, Lord Lieute. nant, and the Earl of Carlifle, went together from the Castle in a Chariot drawn by Six Horses, and preceded by a leading Coach and Six, in which were the Officers of State, to the South-wall beyond Ringsend, where Lord Carlisle embarked on Board the Revenue Barge, for the Yacht which lay in the Bay. They were escorted by a Squadron of Dragoons, and attended by a great Number of the Nobility, Persons of Distinction, the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, several of the Aldermen and Principal Citizens, in their Carriages, followed by a Concourse of People, to the Water Side. The Streets were lined by the Regiments of Infantry on Dublin Duty: and in his Passage through the Streets, Lord Carlisle received every Demonstration of Respect from the People, who tellified their Regard for him by repeated Wishes for his Welfare, and safe Return to Eng-
