HEPEAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 14th of December last to order, that the Prohibition at that Time fublicing upon the Exportation, or carrying of Copper Coattwife, fhould be conti-nued for Six Months, to commence from the 22d Day of December laft: And whereas it har been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, on Behalf of the feveral Companies of Copper Smel-Prohibition of the Export of Sheet Copper onter-ters within the Kingdom in Great Britain, that the Prohibition of the Export of Sheet Copper, as di-rectied by the faid Order, has been very detrimental to the Petitioners and to the Trade of this King-dom in general: His Majefty taking the fame into dom in general: His Majelly taking the fame into Confideration, and being ever defirous to remove all Obftructions upon Trade, fo far as may be con-filtent with found Policy, is hereby pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit and allow Copper in Sheets, weighing lefs than Twelve and more than Forty Ounces to the Foot fuper-ficial, to be carried Coaffwife or exported to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which the fame may be lawfully exported, upon Condition, that all fuch Copper be infpected and examined by an Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Commillioners of His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent of Agents shall be first had and obtained, fet-ting forth, that no Part of such Copper confilts of Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefs than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot superficial; which Certificate from the said Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port in which the faid Copper is intended to be fhipped, and fhall be their Authority for allow-ing the Quantity of Copper fpecified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board, in order to be carried Coaffwife or exported: And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to permit and allow the Ex-portation as aforefaid of Copper in Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefs than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot superficial; provided that the fame shall confist of Pieces not exceeding

Certificate thereof be obtained in Manner above directed, before fuch Copper be laden or put on Board ; and allo to permit the carrying Coaffwife of Copper in Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefe than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot superficial; upon Condition that no more than Five Hundred Weight of fuch Copper shall be shipt by any one Perfon or Partnership, and that the Quantity put on Board any one Ship or Veffel shall not exceed Ten Hun-dred Weight in the Whole, unless Security by Bond hath first been given to the proper Officers of His Majefly's Customs, in Treble the Value of fuch Copper, to carry the fame to the Places proposed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Two Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Ports for which any fuch Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the same having been all duly landed at fuch Ports ; which Certificate or Certificates fuch Officer is hereby required to give ; and the fame Certificate or Certifi-cates the Commissioners of the Customs are hereby equired to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board. And the Lords Commitficners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS divers Perfons have been guilty of the illegal Province of the been guilty of the illegal Practices of claudestine importing and running of prohibited and uncuflomed Goods, and thereby subjected themselves to great Penalties, for which some have been already convicted, fome are in Execution for the fame, and others are under Profecution, and many more liable to fuch Penalties, in Confequence of which they abscond, or are gone into Foreign Parts, which has or may prove the Ruin of themselves and their Families : And whereas they may yet be of Ufe to Us and their Country, in the prefent Conjuncture of Affairs, by ferving Us in Our Navy, in cafe they are rendered capable thereof by Our Gracious Pardon: We, being defirous of giving them an Opportunity of entering into Our Service, and of render-ing themfelves of Service to the Publick, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Proclamation; and We do hereby promife and declare, that in cafe any fit and able Perlon or Perlons, who has or have incurred Surred any Penalties, in, by, or for the clandefine importing, running, landing, relanding; unfhip-bing, concealing, or receiving; or being affiiting in fuch running, landing, relanding, or unfhip-bing, any prohibited Goods; Wares; or Merchan-dizes; or any Goods liable to the Payment of the Duties under the Management of the Correct W Duties under the Management of the Commissioners of Cuftoms, Excife, or Salt, or either of them, or who have beat, abused, obitructed or hindered, any Officer or Officers of the faid Revenues; in the due Execution of their Duty, or by Reason or Means or on Account of any such Offences as aforesaid, or who are under any Profecutions, Judgement, Outlawry, in Prilon, or under or subject to any Execution for any of the faid Offences, or gone beyond Sea to avoid the fame, shall, on or before the First Day of July next, voluntarily enter themfelves as Sailors into Our Service, either with the Officers of Our Ships or Veffels of Our Royal Navy, or other Officers of Our Navy empowered to enter Men to ferve on Board Our faid Ships or Veffels, or shall procure One fit and able Seaman, and One fit and able Landman, for the Service of Our Navy, as Subflitutes to ferve for him, her, or them, fuch as shall be approved by fuch Officer or Officers in Our Sea Service empowered to receive the fame; provided the Penalty to which fuch Perfon or Perfons is or are liable, does not exceed the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds; and fuch Perfon or Perfons who hath or have incurred a Penalty of more than Five Hundred Pounds, and lefs than Two Thoufand Pounds, finding Two fit and able Seamen, and Two fit and able Landmen, for the Service of Our Navy as afore-faid; and fuch Perfon or Perfons who hath or have incurred a Penalty of more than Two Thou-fand Pounds finding Three fit and able Sea-men, and Three fit and able Landmen, for the Service of Our Navy as aforefaid, fuch as shall be approved by such Officer or Officers in Our Sea Service empowered to receive the fame ; all and every fuch Perfon or Perfons, fo ferving, or providing Subflitutes to ferve for him, her, or them, as aforefaid, shall have Our gracious Pardon of and for all and every fuch Offence and Offences, and Penalties, and all Indictments, Informations, Profecutions, Convictions, Judgements, Imprisonments, Executions, and Outlawries, sued, incurred, had or given, or that may arife or accrue for or by Reafon or Means of any of the faid Offences, or other Matters or Things aforefaid, on all fuch Perfon or Perfons to entering or finding Subflitutes, producing to fuch Perfon or Perfons at Our Admiralty Office as shall be there appointed, to be registered by him or them at the Expence of such Person or Persons so entering themfelves or finding Subflitutes, a Certificate or Certificates by the Officer of Officers with whom fuch Perfon or Perfons, Seaman or Seamen. Landman or Land. men, shall be entered, of their having conformed as aforefaid within the Time aforefaid, and which Registration, or a Copy thereof duly authenticated, shall be deemed and taken as Evidence in all Cafes of fuch Conformity, and thali be a fufficient Warrant for the Difcharge of all such Perfons in actual Cuftody for any such Offence : And We do hereby further promife and declare, that in all Cafes where the Party or Parties withing to take the Benefit of this Our Proclamation, who shall not have been profecuted, or being profecuted shall not have been convicted, he, the, or they, thall or may intitle themfelves thereto, by procuring Two fit and able Seamen, and two fit and able Landmen, for the Service of Our Navy, to

The Men who shall inlist with the Recruiting Parties of Regiments on Foreign Stations, or with any of the Independent Companies, are to be entitled to receive the First additional Bounty of THREE GUINEAS on their Arrival at Chatham, Or fuch other Place in Great Britain as they shall be ordered to; and on their being approved there by the Infpector-General of the Recruiting Service, or fuch other Officer as may be appointed for that Purpole.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to the King, That there are at this Time many DESERTERS from the Regular Corps in His Majesty's Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefly's Gracious P A R DON; and that fuch an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due In-fluence on their future Behaviour : His Majesty is pleased to grant His Free PARDON to all DESERTERS from His Regular Land Forces, who shall furrender themfelves before the 17th Day of June next, either to the Regiments to which they belong, or to fome other Regular Corps in His Majefty's Land Service, or to any Additional Company or Recruiting Party thereof in Great-Britain or Ireland.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men and fit for Service, shall be attested in the Corps to which they furrender; and not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.'

And whereas many of the faid Deferters have enlisted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein; His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deserters the Benefit of this Pardon, and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, not being Militia; and they shall not be liable to be claimed by that in which they formerly ferved.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have been apprehended, and are now in Goal, or in Regimental Cuftody; His Majefty is likewife pleafed to grant them His Free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival at their respective Regiments, or upon their being attefted in fome other Regular Corps or Recruiting Party.
