Admiralty-Office, May 14, 1782. HEREAS many Stamen have, from Time to Time, inconfidence by to Time, inconsiderately deserted His Majesty's Service, by leaving the Ships they belonged to, as they could find Opportunity for fo doing, or, having been put on Shore Sick from His Majeily's Ships, either into Hospitals or Sick Quarters, have made fo ill a Return to the Care taken for their Healths as to defert from His Majesty's Service, when so far recovered as to be able to withdraw themselves from the said Hospitals or Sick Quarters; for which Crimes they have incurred the Loss of their Wages, and are punishable with Death by a Court Martial: But my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being willing to impute such Desertion into a Rashness which most of them soon repent of, and believing that they would return to their Ships, were it not from Apprehensions of Punishment; in order therefore to remove such Apprehensions, and encourage them to return to their Duty, there Lordships do hereby declare, That if any Persons who have deserted as aforesaid shall, ou on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, return to the Ships to which they did belong, or, in case those Ships are gone Abroad, enter themselves on Board some other of His Majetty's Ships, they shall not be punished in any Manner whatsoever, on Account of the Crimes they have committed in with-drawing themselves from His Majetty's Service as aforesaid, excepting such as have ben guilty of Mu-tiny, or any other notorious Crimes: And, as a further Encouragement, their Lordships are pleased to declare, that such as shall so return shall have their Rs taken off, and be paid their Wages for the Ships from which they respectively deserted; but their Lordships do also think fit to declare, that all Persons under the above mentioned Circumstances, who do not make a proper Use of the Indulgence hereby offered them, will be firicily fought after, and, (in case they are apprehended) brought to a Court Martial, and treated as the Law directs. Ph Stephens.

Notive, that His Majesty's Free Pardon will be extended to them also, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival at any of the Marine. Head-Quarters.

And any Marine who may defert after this Public Notice of His Majetly's most gracious Intentions, will not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.
