HEREAS many Seamen have, from Time to Time, inconfiderately deferted His Majesty's Service, by leaving the Ships they belonged to, as they could find Opportunity for fo doing, or, having been put on Shore Sick from His Majesty's Ships sither into Hesitals or Sick Opportunity have Ships, either into Hospitals or Sick Quarters, have made so ill a Return to the Care taken for their Healths as to defert from His Majesty's Service, when so far recovered as to be able to withdraw themselves from the said Hospitals or Sick Quarters; for which Crimes they have incurred the Loss of their Wages, and are punishable with Death by a Court Martial: But my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being willing to impute such Deser-tion into a Rashness which most of them soon repent of, and believing that they would return to their Ships, were it not from Apprehensions of Punishment; in order therefore to remove such Apprehensions, and encourage them to return to their Duty, their Lordships do hereby declare, That if any Persons who have deserted as aforesaid shall, ou on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, return to the Ships to which they did belong, or, in case those Ships are gone Abroad, enter themselves on Board some other of His Majesty's Ships, they shall not be punished in any Manner whatsoever, on Account of the Crimes they have committed in with-drawing themselves from His Majesty's Service as aforesaid, excepting such as bave been guilty of Mutiny, or any other notorious Crimes: And, as a fur-ther Enougagement, their Lordships are pleased to declare, that fuch as shall so return shall have. their Rs taken off, and be paid their Wages for the Ships from which they respectively deserted; but their Lordships do also think fit to declare, that all Persons under the above-mentioned Circum-

stances, who do not make a proper Use of the Indulgence hereby offered them, will be strictly sought after, and, (in case they are apprehended) brought to a Court Martial, and treated as the Law directs.
