And whereas many of the faid Deferters have enlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein; His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to such Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon, and to direct that they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, not being Militia; and they shall not be liable to be claimed by that in which they formerly ferved.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters have been apprehended, and are now in Goal, or in Regimental Cuitody; His Majefty is likewife pleafed to grant them His Free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit upon their Arrival at their respective Regiments, or upon their being attested in some other Regular Corps or Recruiting Party.

Any Soldier who may defert, after these His Majesty's most Gracious Intentions are made Pub-lic, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but
