My Lords and Gentlemen,

T gives me the utmost Satisfaction, that the first Time I have the Occasion to address you, I find myfelf enabled, by the Magnanimity of the King, and the Wildom of the Parliament of Great Britain, to affure you that immediate Attention has been paid to your Reprefentations, and that the British Legiflature have concurred in a Refolution to remove the Caufes of your Discontents and Jealousies, and are united in a Defire to gratify every Wifh expressed in your late Address to the Throne. If any Thing could add to the Pleasure I feel in giving you these Affurances, it is, that I can accom-

pany them with my Congratulations on the impor-tant and decifive Victory gained by the Fleets of His Majefty over those of our common Enemy in the Weft Indies, and on the fignal Advantage ob tained by His Majesty's Arms in the Island of Ceylon, and on the Coaft of Coromandel.

By the Papers which in Obedience to his Majefty's Commands I have directed to be laid before you, you will receive the most convincing Testimony of the cordial Reception which your Representations have met with from the Legislature of Great Britain; but His Majefty, whole first and most anxious With is to exercise His Royal Prerogative in such a Manner as may be most conducive to the Welfare of all His faithful Subjects, has further given it me in Com-mand to affure you, of his gracious Difposition • give his Royal Affent to Acts to prevent the Suppret-lion of Bills in the Privy Council of this Kingdom, and the Alteration of them any where, and to limit the Duration of the Act for the better Regulation and Accommodation of His Majefty's Forces in this Kingdom to the Term of Two Years.

W HEREAS many Seamen have, from Time to Time, inconfiderately deferred 11 to Time, inconfiderately deferted His Ma-jefty's Service, by leaving the Ships they belonged to, as they could find Opportunity for fo doing, or, having been put on Shore Sick from His Majefty's Ships, either into Hofpitals or Sick Quarters, have made fo ill a Return to the Care taken for their Healths as to defert from His Majefly's Service, when fo far recovered as to be able to withdraw themfelves from the faid Hofpitals or Sick Quar-ters; for which Crimes they have incurred the Lofs of their Wages, and are punishable with Death by a Court Martial : But my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being willing to impute fuch Defer-tion into a Rashness which most of them soon repent of, and believing that they would return to their Ships, were it not from Apprehensions of Punish-ment; in order therefore to remove such Apprehenfions, and encourage them to return to their Duty, their Lordships do hereby declare, That if any Perfons who have deferted as aforefaid shall, ou on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, return to the Ships to which they did belong, or, in cafe those Ships are gone Abroad, enter themselves on Board some other of His Majesty's Ships, they shall not be punished in any Manner whatfoever, on Account of the Crimes they have committed in with-drawing themselves from His Majetty's Service as around themelves from his Majetty's Service as aforefaid, excepting fuch as have been guilty of Mu-tiny, or any other notorious Grimes: And, as a fur-ther Encouragement, their Lordfhips are pleafed to declare, that fuch as fhall fo return fhall have their R^s taken off, and be paid their Wages for the Ships from which they refpectively deferted; but their Lordfhips do alfo think fit to declare, that all Perfore under the above mentioned Circumall Perfons under the above-mentioned Circumftances, who do not make a proper Use of the Indulgence hereby offe.ed them, will be firicily fought aftery-
