HEREAS many Seamen have, from Time to Time, inconfiderately deferted His Majetty's Service, by leaving the Ships they belonged to, as they could find Opportunity for f doing, or, having been put on Shore bick from His Majefty's Ships, either into Hospitals or Sick Quarters, have made so ill a Return to the Care taken for their Healths as to defert from His Majefty's Service, when to far recovered as to be able to withdraw. themfelves from the faid Holpitals or Sick Quarters ; for which Crimes they have incurred the Lofs of their Wages, and are punishable with Death by a Court Martial : But my Lords Comm floners of the Admiralty being willing to impute fuch Defertion into a Rashness which most of them soon repent of, and believing that they would return to their Ships, were it not from Apprehensions of Punishment; in order therefore to remove such Apprehenfions, and encourage them to return to their Duty, their Lordships do he eby declare, That if any Persons who have deferted as aforefaid shall, ou on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, return to the Ships to which they did belong, or, in cafe those Ships are gone Abroad, enter themselves on Board fome other of His Majesty's Ships, they shall not be punified in any Manner whatloever, on Account of the Crimes they have committed in withdrawing themfelves from His Majetty's Service as aforefaid, excepting fuch as have been guilty of Mutiny, or any other notorious Crimes : And, as a further Encouragement, their Lordships are pleased to declare, that fuch as shall so return shall have their Rs taken off, and be paid their Wages for the Ships from which they respectively deferted; but their Lordships do also think fit to declare, that all Perfons under the above-mentioned Circumstances, who do not make a proper Use of the Indulgence hereby offered them, will be ftrictly fought after, and, (in cafe they are apprehended) brought to a Court Martial, and treated as the Law directs.
