Admirally-Office, May 14, 1782. WHEREAS many Seamen have, from Time to Time, inconfiderately deferted His Majefty's Service, by leaving the Ships they belonged to, as they could find Opportunity for fo doing, or, having

having been put on Shore Sick from His Majefty's Ships, either into Hofpitals or Sick Quarters, have made fo ill a Return to the Care taken for their Healths as to defert from His Majelly's Service, when fo far recovered as to be able to withdraw themselves from the faid Hospitals or Sick Quarters ;' for which Crimes they have incurred the Lofs of their Wages, and are punishable with Death by a Court Martial: But my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being willing to impute fuch Defertion into a Rashness which most of them soon repent of, and believing that they would return to their Ships, were it not from Apprehensions of Punishment; in order therefore to remove fuch Appre-hensions, and encourage them to return to their Duty, their Lordships do hereby declare, That if any Perfons who have deferted as aforefaid fhall, ou on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, return to the Ships to which they did belong, or, in cafe thole Ships are gone Abroad, enter themfelves on Board fome other of His Majetty's Ships, they shall not be punished in any Manner whatsoever, on Account of the Crimes they have committed in withdrawing themselves from His Majelty's Service as aforefaid, excepting fuch as have been guilty of Mutiny, or any other notorious Crimes : And, as a further Encouragement, their Lordships are pleased to declare, that fuch as shall so return shall have their R<sup>3</sup> taken off, and be paid their Wages for the Ships from which they respectively deserted ; but their Lordships do also think fit to declare, that all Perfons under the above-mentioned Circum-ftances, who do not make a proper Ule of the Indulgence hereby offered them, will be strictly fought after, and, (in cafe they are apprehended) brought to a Court Martial, and treated as the Law directs.
