jefty, with Two or more fufficient Sureties; be-fore the Lord Chief Baron, or Two other of the Barons of Els Majefty's Court of Exchequer at Westminster, in the Penalty of Fifty Thou-fand Pounds for the faid John Whitehill, Elquire, and in the Penalty of Twenty Thousand Pounds for his Sureties, no One of fuch Sureties being in a lefs Penalty than Five Thousand Pounds ! Which faid feveral Recognizances fhould be made upon this Condition; That if the faid John Whitehill, Esquire, who should enter into such Recognizance, fhould not go or depart out of this Kingdom before the First Day of February, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-three, then such Recognizances should be void, otherwise the same should remain in Force : And in cafe the faid John Whitehill, Efquire, should neglect to enter into such Recognizance within the Space of Twenty-eight Days next after his Return into this Kingdom, he fhould, by the faid Lord Chief Baron or Barons, or any Two or more of them, be committed to the Prifon of the Fleet, there to remain, without Bail or Mainprize, until the faid First Day of February, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-three, or until he should enter into fuch Recognizance with Sureties as aforefaid; and the faid Chief Baron or Barons, or any I wo or more of them, were thereby respectively authorised and required to iffue his or their Warrant or Warrants for that Purpole : And if the faid John Whitehill, Elquire, should, before the First Day of February, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, go or depart out of this Kingdom, he, and all and every Person or Persons who should willingly be ai ling and affifting to fuch Departure, should forfeit to the King, His Heirs and Succeffors, all and fingular his, her, or their Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and all and fingular his, her, or their Perfonal Effate and Effects, of what Nature or Kind soever.

And by the faid Act it was alfo recited, that, in cafe the faid John Whitehill, Efquire, fhould not return into this Kingdom, and enter into Recognizance in the Manner before-mentioned, within the Space of Forty-two Days next after fuch Notices should be inferted in the London Gazette as aforefaid, he the faid John Whitehill, Efquire, ought to be confidered as wilfully abfenting himfelf out of this Kingdom for the Purpole of avoiding Justice; it was thereby further enacted, that if the faid John Whitehill, Esquire, should not, within the Space of Twenty Days after the Expiration of the Forty-two Days therein before-mentioned, return into this Kingdom, fo as to be liable to Justice in Parliament, but fhould wilfully continue to absent himself from the fame, then, and in such Case, he the faid John Whitehill, Esquire, should forfeit to His Majefty, his Heirs and Succeffors, all and fingular his Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, Goods, Chattels, Debts, and Perfonal Estate, of what Kind or Nature soever: Now in pursuance of the faid Act, Notice is hereby given to the faid John Whitehill, Efquire, and he is hereby required to return into this Kingdom within the Space of Fortytwo Days next after the Publication hereof Three feveral Times in the London Gazette, to do and perform the feveral Things in the faid recited Act mentioned, and thereby directed to be done and performed by him
