Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Evans, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Portsmouth, to Mr. Stephens, dated August 4, 1782.

HIS Majesty's Ship *Proserpine* sent in Yesterday, after Post, the *Voltigeur*, a French Privateer, of Sixteen Guns and Sixty-three Men.
