*Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Evans, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Portsmouth, to Mr. Stephens, dated August 4, 1782.*

**H**IS Majesty's Ship *Proserpine* sent in Yesterday, after Post, the *Voltigeur*, a French Privateer, of Sixteen Guns and Sixty-three Men.

**I**N Pursuance of the Directions of an Act passed in the Tenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An Act to enable the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrants to make out new Writs for the Choice of Members to serve in Parliament, in the room of such Members as shall die during the Recess of Parliament;" I do hereby give Notice, That the Death of Robert Child, Esquire, late Member of Parliament for the City of Wells in the County of Somerset, hath been certified to me in Writing, under the Hands of Two Members of Parliament: And that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the Electing of a Citizen to serve in this present Parliament for the said City of Wells, in the room of the said Robert Child, Esquire, deceased, at the End of Fourteen Days after the Insertion of this Notice in the Gazette.
