**T**HE King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Landaff, for electing a Bishop of that See, the same being vacant by the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Shute Barrington, late Bishop thereof, to the Bishoprick of Salisbury; and also a Letter to the said Dean and Chapter, recommending the Reverend Richard Watson, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Landaff.

The King has been pleased to grant to Ann Sleigh, Spinster, and the Heirs Male of her Body (pursuant to the Will of John Lindley, late of Skigby in the County of Nottingham, Esq; deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Lindley, and to bear the Arms of Lindley, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has been pleased to appoint William Wyndham Grenville, Esq; to be of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council in the Kingdom of Ireland.
