Constantinople, August 1.

THE Conflagration which raged in the Center of this City on the 24th Ult. was fortunately stopped at Eight o'Clock the same Evening; and though it broke out again in different Parts of the Ruins, it was totally got under by Eleven. The Grand Signior remained on the Spot upwards of Twenty-two Hours. It was at first reported that upwards of 20,000 Houses had been reduced to Ashes, and that great Numbers of Janissaries and others lost their Lives, by the rapid Progress of the Flames, which in different Places proved fatal to the Workmen: It is however to be hoped that these Accounts are greatly exaggerated, and that the Number of Houses actually destroyed may be reduced to about Nine Thousand, three fourths of which were very small, and inhabited by the poorest Sort of the Inhabitants.

The Plague seems to be almost suspended here by a few Days of excessive hot and dry Weather; but no Letters have been received for this Week past from Smyrna or Salonica.
