THE King has been pleased to grant to Thomas Calvert, of Warlaby in the County of York, Esq; and his Heir, (pursuant to the Will of John Booth, late of Killerby in the County of York, Esq; deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Booth, and also to bear the Arms of Booth, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has been pleased to appoint Robert Stewart and James Cuffe, Esquires, to be of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council in the Kingdom of Ireland.

Extract of a Letter from Lieutenant Arthur Hayne, commanding His Majesty's Cutter Cruizer, to Mr. Stephens, dated Weymouth Road, September 11, 1782.

YOU will be pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that on the 10th Instant, at One P. M. the Island of Alderney bearing S. S. W. Distance Six Leagues, we discovered a Sail to the North-West; and, after a Chace of Seven Hours, came up with and took her.

She proved to be Le Petit Commandant, of 8 Four and Three Pounders, and 32 Men; and commanded by William Ripner: This Cutter belonged to Dunkirk.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Courtenay, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Eurydice, to Mr. Stephens, dated off Cape Le Hage, September 11, 1782.

I AM to inform you, that at Nine A. M. I fell in with a small French Cutter Privateer off Cherburgh, and another Sloop her Prize, which she had taken the preceding Evening off the Isle of Wight, both of which I captured after a short Chace, and sent the Privateer to Guernsey, and the English Sloop to Weymouth. This Privateer had only Eight Men on Board; the Master, whose Name is Moor, has been lately a Strolling Player in the West of England.

I am further to inform you, that, on the 1st of this Month A. M. I gave Chace to a French Galley, a Cutter, and a Sloop, and drove them on Shore under the Forts of Carieret.

Yesterday his Grace the Lord Lieutenant was pleased to confer the Honor of Knighthood on John Morella Oldmixon, Esq; Lieutenant of Dragoons, and one of the Gentlemen in Waiting in his Grace's Family.

Stockholm, August 27. On Sunday Morning, the 25th Instant, the Queen of Sweden was safely delivered of a Prince; which important Event was announced here by the Discharge of 216 Pieces of Cannon. Her Majesty and the new-born Prince continue as well as can be expected.

Berlin, September 7. His Prussian Majesty arrived at Potsdam the 2d Instant, in good Health, after finishing the usual Reviews in Silesia.
