This Privateer had only Eight Men on Board; the Mafter, whole Name is Moor, has been lately a Strolling Player in the West of England.

I am jurther to inform you, that, on the 1st of this Month A. M. I gave Chace to a French Galley, a Cutter, and a Sloop, and drove them on Shore under the Forts of Carteret.
