and afterwards to pais the Rhine. Of the Germans we do not allow here above 100 to have been killed, belides wounded; and we fay the lofs on the French file is as great; Morfheur de la Hiya Brigadie ribeing amoug uther Officers killed, and a Captain of Horfe brought prifoner hither. The French have burnt Wilftet, where was 1500 Load of Hay.

Cologne, Sept. 24. Our Elector has given out Commillions for the railing a Regiment of Foot to confift in 600 men, and to be commanded by Colonel Nerpraet. His Electoral Highnels defigns likewife to raife a Regiment of Cavalry, but it is become a very difficule matter to find in these parts Horfes fir for that ufe. The Emperor is to furnith his Electoral High-<sup>3</sup>nefs with 3000 Foot, purfuant to the Treaty lately conclu ed between them, by vertue whereof, we expect he will now fuddenly go and refide at Bonne. The French st Macstricht threaten that they will entire'y defiroy the Dutchy of Fuliers, his Highnels the Duke of Neusurg, to prevent the fame, has fent his Deputies to Maeffricht to treat with the French Intendant there. From Allace our Letters give us an account, that the Mareschal de Crequi had passed the Rhine above strasburg, and that that City was not without apprehenfions that the French would make arrattempt to deftroy their Bridge, becaule of the passage they have permit-ted at leveral times to the Imperial Troops and those of the Circles, contrary to the obligation of their Neutrality.

Bruffels, Sept. 28. On Sunday his Highness the Prince of Orange paffed near this City in his return towares Holland, and in his way vifited the Fort called the Three Holes; his Highness dined at Vituerd, accompanied by the Duke of Albemarie, the Earl of Offery, the Earl of Plimouth, and feveral Officers of his own Army. The last night his Highness came to Breda, where he intended to reft as this day, and to be to morrow at Soeffdike. Yesterday Monsieur Ouerkirke went from hence to Antwerp, in order to embark in his Highnesses Yacht, which attends him there, not bring able to take his journy by Land, by reason of the indifposition that continues upon him. Most of the Prince of Oranges Infantry will winter in thefe Prowinees, if not all. His Highneffes Regiment of Footguards, and the four English Regiments, have orders to march to Breds and other places where they winte-red the laft year. The Duke de Vills Hermofa is expefed here in few days, and in the mean time has given orders for the fortifying of Hall, and the building of a Fort Royal ar the entrance into the Wood of Soignees, to fecure the paffage from hence to Mont, and to cut off the intercoursebetween Aeth and Charleroy. Ir is faid that Enghien and Nivelle will be likewife foreified, The French Army continues fill between the Lis and the Schelde near Audenarde : 24 great pieces of Can-non are difembarked here out of some Dutch Billanders, andrare at present placed on our Market-place, bis Excellency as they fay having bought them. Baron de Lumber hath lately quitted his Regiment, as likewife the Marquis de Morbeck, being reloved to serire to -his Effate in the French Territories; and, it's faid, feveral other perfons of quality will do the like if a Peace be not concluded this winter.

Ghent, Sept. 30. In our former we tald you, that the French had demanded a great Sum, by way of Contribution: from eight Villages or Parishes belonging to this City, which not having been paids on Friday laft the Marefchal d' Humieres, with 7 or 8000 men paffed the Schelde and came into the Land of Neyels. On Sunday we received a reinforcement of 800 Foot, and 100 Horfe from Eruges. On Monday the Fuench came to Mariekiske, where they saffed the Canal of Bruges, and burnt the Villages of Mexicftede, Golikeufen, Oftacker Diffeldonck, Leochrifti, and Diffelbergen, with feveral fine Caliles. Y etterday they returned again to Neuel, and this day are come again to near us that wo difcharge ur Cannon upon them.

Hague, Qflob. 1., On Wednelday his Highnels the Prince of Orange atrived at Honflierdike, and this morning about 11 clock came hicher.
