Of the Germans wedo not allow here abuve 100 to have been killed, bebides wounded; and we fay che lofs on the French fice isas great ; Monficur de la Haye Brigadit rbeing amoug uther Officers killed, and a Captain of Horfe broughs prifuner hicher. The French bave burne Wilfet, where was 1500 Load of Hav.

Cologne, s'ept. 24. Our Elector has given out Commilitions for the raifing a Reqiment of Foot to confilt in 600 men, and to he commanced by Colonel Nerpraet. His Electoral Highnefs defigns likewife to raife a Regiment of Cavalry, bur it is become a very difficule materer to find in thefe parts Horfes fir for that ufe. The Emperor is to furnith his Electoral High${ }^{3}$ nefs with 3000 Foot, purfuane to the Treay lately conclu 'ed between them, by vertue whereof, we expect he will now fuddenly go and refide at Bonne. The trench at Macflichto virescen that they will entire'y deftroy the Dutchy of $\mathfrak{F}$ uliers, his Higlinefs the Duke of Ncuburg, to prevent the fame, has fent ais Depuries to Maeftricht to trear with the French Intendant there. From Alface our Letrers give us an account, that the Marefichal de Crequithad paffed the Rhine above stras$b y \cdot g$, and that that City was not without ayprehenfrons that the Franch would make arrattempt co deftroy their Bridge, becaufe of the paffage they have permitted at feveral timesto the Imperial Troops and thofe of the Circles, cortrary to the obligation of their Neutrality.

Bruffeis, Sept. 28. On Sunday his Highnefs the Prince of Orange paffed near this Ciry in his recurn towar. 3 Holdand, and in his way vilated the Fort called the Tbrec Holes; his Highnefs dined at Vituord, accompunied by the Duke of Albemarle, the Earl of Offe$y$ y, the Earl of Plimouth, and feveral Officers of his own Army. The latt night his Highrefs came to Breda, where he intended to reftas this day, and to be to morrow at soefidike. Yefterday Monfeur Ouer$k i r k e$ went from hence to $A x t w e r p$, in order to embark in his Highneffes Yaehr, which actends him thete, not bring able to talke his j jurny by Land, by reafon of the indifpofition that continues upon him. Moft of the Prince of Oranges Infantry will wister in tbefe Provinees, if not a!l. His Highneffes Regiment of Footguards, and the foar Euglilh Regiments, have orders ro march to Breds and other places where they wintered ehe laftyear. Thie Duke de Nilla Hermofa is expeeted herein few davs, and in the mean time has given ordess for the fortifying of $H \Delta l l$, and the building of a Fore Royalatathe entranceinto the Wood of soignees, to fecure the paffage from hence so mont, and to cut of the intercourfebetween Aeth and cherheroj. In is faid that Enghicn and Nivelle will be likewifeforsifed. The Frenct Army continues ftill berween the tis and the Schelde near Andenarde: 24 great pieces of Can. non aye difembarked here out of fome Dutch Billanders, andareat prefent placed on our Market-pirce, his Excellency as they fay having bought thom. Baron de Lumber hatb lately quisted his Regiment, as likewife the Marquis de Morbeck, being refolved to 1 erire 10 - his Eftare in the French Territories; and, $i i^{\prime}$ 's faid, $\mathfrak{f e}$ veral ather perfons of quality will do the like ifa Peace be not concluded thiswinter.

Gbent, Se㢆. 30.
