Last Thursday the Ceremony of the Baptism of his Royal Highness the Duke of Smalande was performed in the Royal Chapel of the Court, with all possible Splendor; the Sponfors being the Kings of Prussia and Denmark, the Empress of Russia, and her most Christian Majesty and the King of Sweden's Brothers and Sisters. His Royal Highness is named Charles Gustavus.
