Whiteball, October 26. HE following Letter has been written, purfuant to His Majelty's express Command, by the Right Honourable Tho-mas Townshend, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department :

Whiteball, October 22, 1782.

To the Chairman of the Sellions of the Perce for the County of Middleiez.

S I R

H IS Majesty being very much concerned at the frequent Robberies and Diforders of late committed in the Streets of London and Weilminster, and Parts adjacent, and being informed that they are greatly to be imputed to the Encouragement given to Rogues and their Accomplices, by Perfons who keep Night-houles and Cellars, which are reforted to by great Numbers of loofe and diforderly Perfons; and that the Gaming-houfes, as alfo the Places where Strong Liquors are drunk to Excels, contribute much to the Corruption of the Morals of those of an inferior Rank, and to the leading them into thefe wicked Courfes, has commanded me to recommend it, in His Name, in the firongest Manner, to the juffices of the Peace for the County of Middle-fex, to employ their utmost Care and Vigilance in preventing and fupprefling these Diforders, by holding frequent Petty Seffions for this Purpole in their feveral Parishes, or other Divisions, by calling be. fore them the High Conflables and other proper Officers under their Direction, and giving them the flrictest Orders and Warrants, from Time to Time, as there shall be Occasion, to fearch for and appre-hend Rogues, Vagabonds, idle and diforderly Per-fons, in order to their being dealt with according to Law; and likewife to proceed with Rigour as well against all Perfons harbouring fuch Offenders, as against those who keep the faid Night-houses or Cellars, Tippling or common Gaming-houfes, or

who practice or encourage unlawful Gaming. And His Majelty having very much at Heart the Performance of this Service, wherein the Ho-nor of His Government, the Prefervation of the Peace, and the Safety of His Subjects are fo much concerned, does further require the faid Juffices in their respective Sellions to draw up in Writing, from Time to Time, an Account of their Proceed-ings herein, inferting the Names of the Juffices attending fuch Meetings, and of the Peace Officers whom they shall employ, taking particular No tice of the Zeal and Diligence of each of them in the Performance of his Duty; which Accounts are to be transmitted from the said several Sessions to One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, to be laid before His Majelly; who being informed of their Behaviour may reward fuch of them as shall diffinguish themselves in the faithful and diligent Execution of their Office; His Majefty not doubting but the Justices, on their Part, will take Care to punifh with Rigour, as by Law they may, those who shall appear to have been guilty of Cor-

ruption or Negligence therein. You will be pleafed to acquaint the Juffices of the Peace for the faid County, and all others whom it may concern, with His Majesty's Pleasure, that the fame may be duly and punctually complied with. I am, &c.
