And as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is also pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid (except as before is excepted) to be paid by the Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders.
